As one of Cape Town's oldest neighbourhoods Woodstock is an area of **great historical value**. Having escaped the Group Areas Act it has always been and remains an area rich in **cultural diversity**. Woodstock has seen much regeneration

over the last few years with urban renewal and clever revamping of old buildings as local business has sought commercial space in what has become one of Cape Town's trendiest and most unique neighbourhoods.

Chapel Street Clinic plays a vital role in providing **healthcare** to the local community delivering invaluable services on a daily basis. Emphasis is placed on **child health** and an extensive program for infants and children is provided by a group of capable and experienced staff. Another area of high priority is the implementation of the **National Tuberculosis Program** where patients are both screened and treated for TB. In addition to the above the clinic provides a unique service to City of Cape Town's staff members in the form of the **Employee Wellness programme**. This programme

confidentially monitors members of the City Council who are living with HIV/AIDS and provides support and counselling to family members of these employees. City Health has also committed to rolling out a program for **antenatal care** making it a clinic which will be invested right from the very beginning of a child's life as well as providing exemplary maternal healthcare. An already established drive to provide **women** with the unique healthcare required means that the City of Cape Town has positioned the clinic to deliver a **holistic service** in the true sense of the word.

## PROPOSED RENOVATIONS

Include the following:

### PAINTING

- Paediatric consultation rooms (x4)
- Baby weighing area
- Patient waiting area
- Counselling room
- Exterior of building
- Staff areas
- Reception area

### DRY WALLING

- Building of new immunisation room
- Building of partitions to demarcate various areas within clinic

### REFURBISHMENT

- Soft furnishings throughout the clinic

### STRUCTURAL

- Removal of tarmac surrounding clinic
- Building of perimeter wall
- Installation of children's play area

### COSMETIC

- Planting of garden around clinic

## BUDGET

The sum quoted to perform these critical changes is in excess of R1 million. The University of Cape Town Lung Institute has been appointed to manage and implement
